Sales and Listings:

2024 has already shown itself to be very active and as of this Cove issue deadline (03/10/24), Cummings Cove Realty has closed three lot sales and two residential dual agency sales. Additionally, Cummings Cove Realty's listing at 69 Mountain Elder marketed at \$1,275,000.00 is now set to close with the contract having concluded Due Diligence early entering full contract on 03/07/24.

The final two townhome sales represented by Cummings Cove Realty in the Golfview Town Houses Project went into full contract at the end of February and are actively moving towards completion with closing anticipated for late third quarter 2024. Cummings Cove Realty also has three active residential listing agreements; one that started active showings on 03/08/24, another that will go showing active on 03/11/24 and another that will go showing active on 04/02/24. Construction:

The first quarter of 2024 has also been an active one for new home construction starts and completions with additional builds that started in 2023 also moving towards completion. Cummings Cove Realty closed fifteen lots in 2023 with most buyers looking to start construction sooner than later.

Future Development:

For over a year Cummings Cove Realty has been involved in the Developer Owner's efforts to make Phase VIII a reality. Phase VIII is part of the Cummings Cove Master Plan which involves approximately fifty developable acres reaching south from the southern side of Tomahawk Trail. The number of wooded home sites slated for creation is estimated to be approximately sixty. This is all land still needing roads and full utility installation. It is currently estimated that the first lot/build sales will not take place until sometime in 2025. The infrastructure construction start date is still yet to be determined. Anyone wanting to see a visual map of the proposed planning layout for Phase VIII can stop by the Sales & Information Center.
